Bringing History to Life

Real World History is a **FREE**, innovative, credit-bearing, history course offered by Center for Inspired Teaching. Available to all public and public charter high school students in Washington, DC, this after-school course equips students with crucial skills that prepare them to thrive in our complex 21st century world.

Fall Semester

Students build the skills of a historian, including contextualization, corroboration, and sourcing. The semester culminates with an oral history project in which students interview a local Washingtonian who was part of the Great Migration. Projects will be preserved in DC Public Libraries.



Spring Semester

Students complete a 100-hour internship at a historic site or museum. Each site provides students with the opportunity to contribute to ongoing projects in meaningful ways while learning about public history. This provides authentic work experience and exposure to a field rarely introduced to high school students.
